February Meeting – Nicholas Abbey spoke about the exciting Springthorpe Project. Among the key themes in the project (a collaboration between Springthorpe, La Trobe University and Darebin Council) are:

- Local Indigenous history
- European settlers
- Landscape design and horticultural history (including the work of Hugh Linaker)
- Hospital and psychiatric care history (Mont Park and Larundel)
- Key individuals such as Dr John Springthorpe and Dr Ernest Jones
- Architectural and heritage-listed buildings history
- Hospital links to World War 1 returned soldiers and other military history
- natural, geological, botanical and ecological history (including the wildlife reserves)
- History of the Springthorpe estate

Around this time, GHS member Rosie Bray was injured when knocked down by a car crossing the road near Safeway. Rosie is a key member of the Thursday Crew and was sorely missed whilst recuperating from her injuries. Rosie wrote this piece from her hospital bed:

April 25th is always a very special but sad day for Rosie Bray.

This year, for the first time, Rosie has not been able to pay tribute to her dear Dad, who was killed 26/6/1941. Captain Thomas Thrupp died on active service and for Rosie and her mother, both felt the loss so badly.

Every ANZAC Day Rosie pays tribute to her Dad at the Greensborough War Memorial Park Service. Only a small tribute but it means so much to her.

This year was different because an accident has prevented the personal tribute at the ANZAC Service.

However, Alexandra, Tom and Emma Brooks took Rosie's place and paid tribute to Captain Thomas Thrupp. These young people eagerly leapt to do this small task - absent Rosie B. but present via these three young people.

So the ANZAC Spirit lives on via this generation.

A vote of gratitude and thanks to Alexandra, Tom and Emma Brooks for their absolute kindness to just one of the community.

April Meeting – at our ANZAC meeting, GHS Treasurer John Gibson delivered a very interesting presentation on the World War I service of Charles Marshall. Charlie's photographs and diaries were made available to John by Charlie's daughter. Thank you, John, for another great ANZAC meeting. A huge amount of preparation goes into these talks, from the research to scanning of photographs and organising the information into a cohesive presentation. June Meeting – We were joined by many descendants of the Whatmough family when Jacinta Crealy launched her book *Robert Whatmough* - *Pioneering Victorian Horticulturalist.* Jacinta's talk covered both her research and Robert Whatmough's life.

July Meeting – Ella Hughes, Gallery Manager of Bundoora Homestead Art

Gallery spoke to the meeting about the history of the Homestead from Smith family home to Convalescent Farm for returned servicemen, to Repatriation Mental Hospital before finally becoming a public art gallery for the Darebin community.

Also in July – GHS members attended an Art Installation by Jessie Stanley at WaterMarc. With soil sourced locally this work revealed some of the area's history - the text running around the perimeter was written by former resident -and GHS member - Val Wilson, a snippet of her recollections of growing up in the area in the 1950s.

August Meeting – our guest speaker was Jillian Durance who shared a wonderful collection of World War I postcards sent from the battlefield to Greensborough. The recipient was Ivy Partington, with most cards sent by her 'sweetheart' and later husband, Herb Godber. Other postcards were from 'Boro boys including Fred Starling, A.K. Lines and Walter West (who thanked Ivy for the newspapers). The postcards showed the intertwined friendships in rural Greensborough in the early 1900s. The album in which the postcards are displayed was a gift to Ivy from her future in-laws on August 22, 1917, 100 years before Jillian shared them with us.

September Meeting – The meeting began with the Society's AGM at which the Committee of Management was returned for another year. Our guest speaker was GHS member Bryan Henderson who commenced with a general history of the scouting movement. Bryan and all of his siblings were involved in Scouts or Brownies, with Bryan and his brother George becoming Queen's Scouts. During his talk, Bryan told some corny 'campfire' jokes, taught us to tie a 'reef knot' and showed us his Jamboree shirt. Bryan then presented a 1951 'Pathfinder Badge' report by Neil McPherson from Preston. Neil travelled throughout Greensborough making observations about the area in great detail considering he was only 15! His report gives an insight into the area at the time.





During the cold **Winter** months, the Thursday Crew battled the cold in the Resource Centre. The ancient heating/cooling in the building was not able to cope. Committee member Anne Paul prepared an application for a "Stronger Communities Grant" (from the federal government's Department of Industry, Innovation and Science) to replace the old units with more efficient split system air conditioning. The application was successful and we hope to have the new units installed in time for our return in 2018.

October Meeting – our Heritage Meeting for 2017 began with Noel leading a walk through the Yandell Reserve, followed by the launch of the Society's second book *Do You Recall?* by Banyule Mayor Cr Tom Melican. This was the culmination of several year's work in collecting stories, interviewing people and writing their stories, then selecting and editing these stories into book format. A real group effort, mainly by members of the Thursday Crew, and a big thank you to all contributors.

We were thrilled to be joined by many of the people whose stories appear in the book, presenting each with a copy of *Do You Recall?* A delicious afternoon tea followed the launch and many reminiscences were shared by those present.



Copies are available via the GHS website, at Society meetings and over the counter at several local outlets.

November Meeting – we finished the year with a collection of photos of Greensborough and surrounding areas from our archive, presented by GHS Secretary Norm Colvin. Norm's local knowledge always informs and entertains, and this annual presentation is in it's third year.

December – no meeting, but the Thursday Crew celebrated a successful year and the start of the summer break. The Resource Centre will be closed from Thursday 14th December and re-open on Thursday 18th January 2018.

Breaking News – Our long-awaited Main Street plaques arrived this week and will be installed early in 2018. More details in the New Year.

Greensborough Primary School 2062 will celebrate its 140th Anniversary in 2018. GHS is assisting the school with historical information and we will keep you informed of developments. The celebration is planned for August, date to be confirmed.

Greensborough Football Club will celebrate its 125th Anniversary in 2018.
